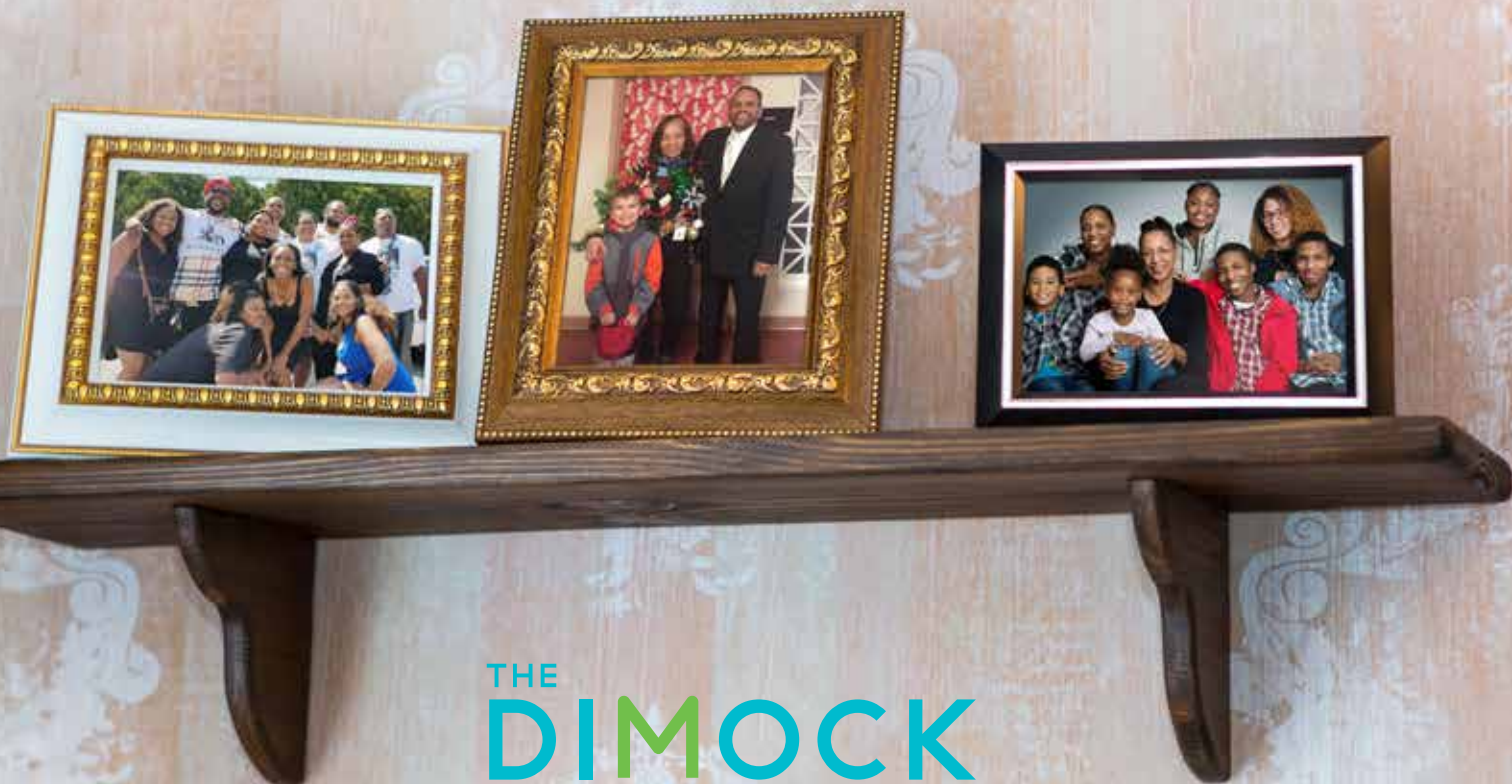

PATIENT FAMILY PROFILE

There for families, generation after generation

Rowena Golay started visiting The Dimock Center in 1987. At the time, she was a single mother addicted to drugs. She credits a Dimock staff member called Lorraine with helping to change her life. Lorraine supported Rowena throughout her pregnancies, helped her apply for the WIC food assistance program, and supported her in her recovery. Over the years, Rowena used a variety of Dimock's services including Adult Medicine, Eye Care, Behavioral Health, and the Adult Education's high school equivalency exam preparation program.

“I learned quickly that the door at Dimock is always open,” shared Rowena. “They’ve always been there for me without any judgment.”

Dimock was there for Rowena's family as well. Her children visit our team at Dimock's Pediatric Clinic and her three youngest kids are enrolled in Dimock's Early Childhood Education program (now called Dimock Foundations for Learning).

When Rowena's daughter Shanice became pregnant as a teenager, she, too, turned to Dimock, visiting Dimock's Obstetrics and Gynecology department. Once Shanice gave birth, the Pediatrics team saw Shanice and her daughter for appointments at the same time, making life a little easier for the new mother.

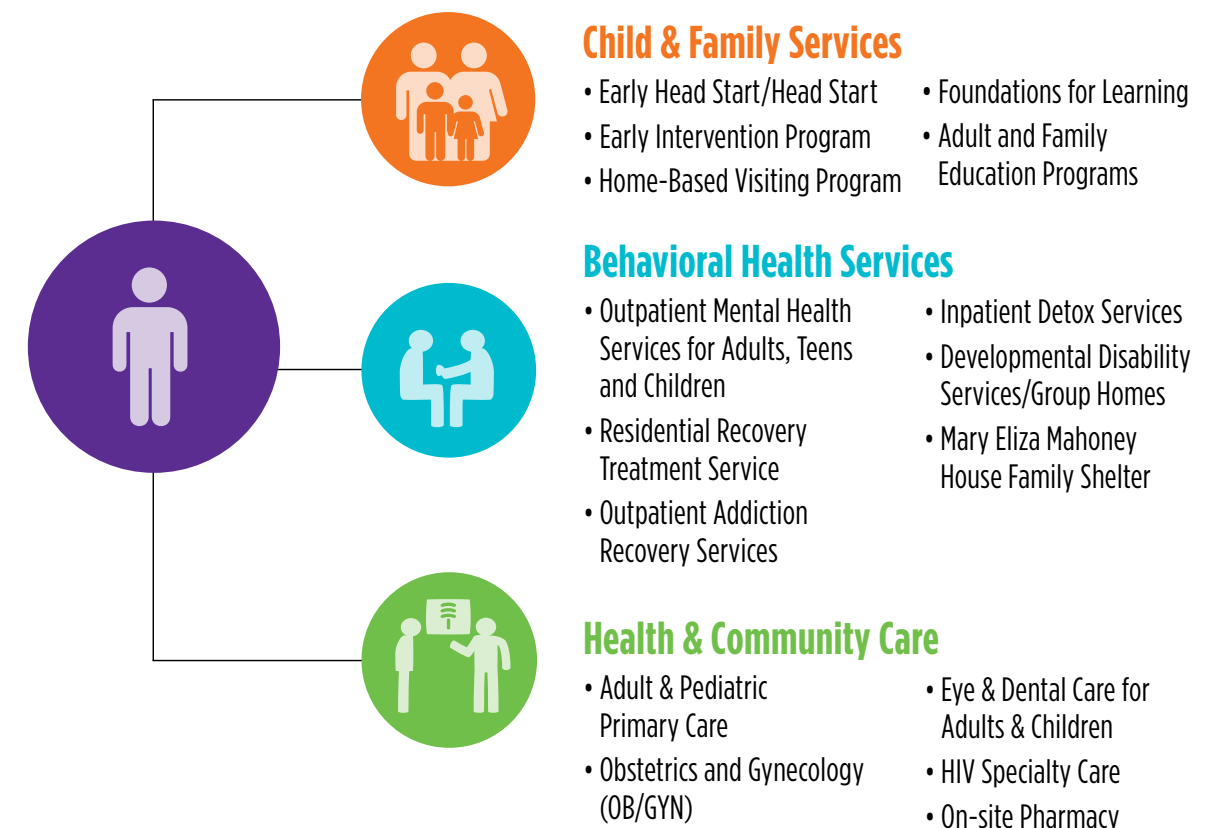
Rowena has now been sober for 21 years. She has 10 children, 28 grandchildren and five great grandchildren, who all keep her very busy. Including Rowena, her mother, children, grandchildren and great-grandchildren, Dimock has served five generations of the Golay family.

“The team at Dimock follows up to remind us of appointments and check in on how we're doing,” explained Rowena. “Life can be hard enough sometimes; Dimock makes it easier.”

Dimock Takes A Leading Role in Addressing Opioid Use

In an article written by The Boston Globe's Brian MacQuarrie on August 6, Dimock program manager Barry Butler and Vice President of Behavioral Health, Mark Libon were cited in an article investigating the media's role in the delay in addressing opioid usage as a public health crisis, leaving the opioid usage to grow largely unchecked by public scrutiny. The piece focused its attention on the challenges hospitals and healthcare providers were facing, inadequately equipped to provide the care and treatment necessary.

Groundbreaking for the Dr. Lucy Sewall Center for Acute Treatment Services

The Bay State Banner covered The Dimock Center's January 17, 2017 groundbreaking for the renovation of the Dr. Lucy Sewall Center for Acute Treatment Services, Dimock's aging detoxification center. The project, a result of a \$16.4 million capital campaign, will enable Dimock to strengthen its comprehensive substance use disorder treatment and enable 1,000 more people per year to access its services.

Dimock One Of Three Health Centers Chosen For \$10 Million Grant

The Boston Globe

The Dimock Center made news in September 2016 in the Boston Globe as one of recipients of \$10 million in funding from the Richard and Susan Smith Family Foundation. The grant will enable Dimock, and three other health centers, to create a model that combines mental health care with primary care for children. The initiative was developed to offer children in the region better access to mental health services. Dr. Nandini Sengupta, Dimock's medical director of health services said the project is working to determine how primary care doctors can work together with behavioral health specialists and community health workers, with a main focus on the development of screening to determine treatment needs.

RIZE Massachusetts



The Dimock Center's participation in the new nonprofit RIZE Massachusetts was called out in a March 28, 2017 news article by local NPR station, WBUR. The organization plans to raise \$50 million over a three year period to support innovative efforts to fight opioid and substance use disorder in the state. On the RIZE board with Dimock are executives of the GE Foundation, Blue Cross Blue Shield of Massachusetts, Cape Cod Healthcare, 1199SEIU United Healthcare Workers East, Learn to Cope, Partners HealthCare and Boston Medical Center. "The opioid epidemic has had a tragic impact on our Commonwealth's families and communities, and we are always encouraged to have new partners joining efforts to curb this crisis," Governor Charlie Baker said in a statement released by RIZE. "We welcome RIZE Massachusetts (in) joining the intense focus our administration and others have placed on fighting this devastating epidemic."

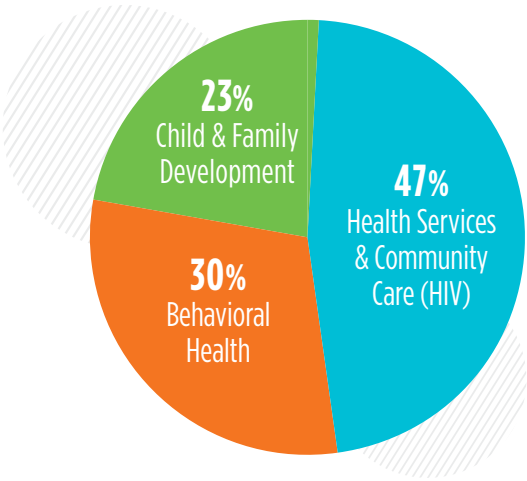

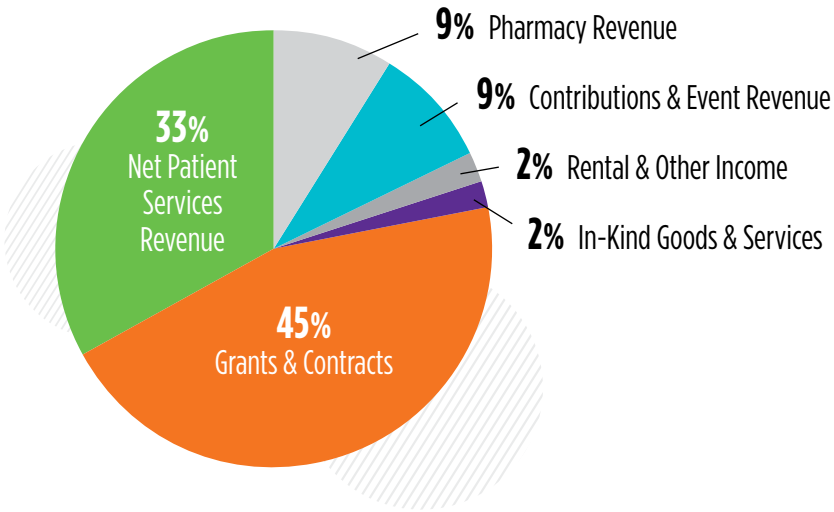

Operating Expenses by Program

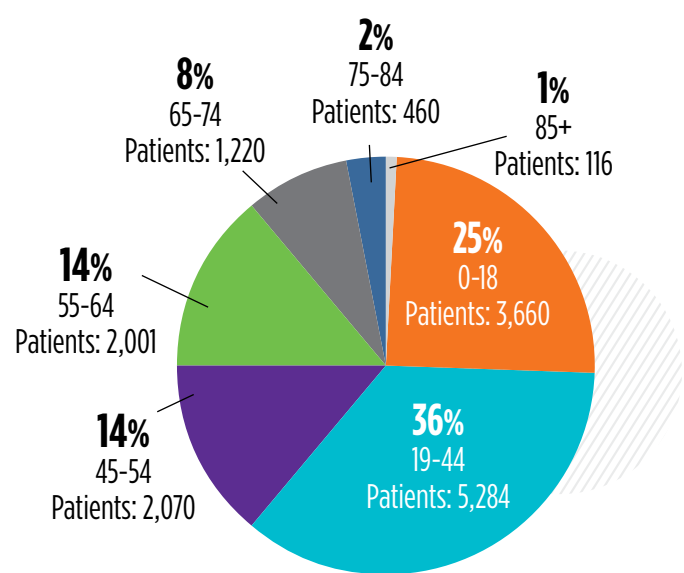


Operating Revenue by Source



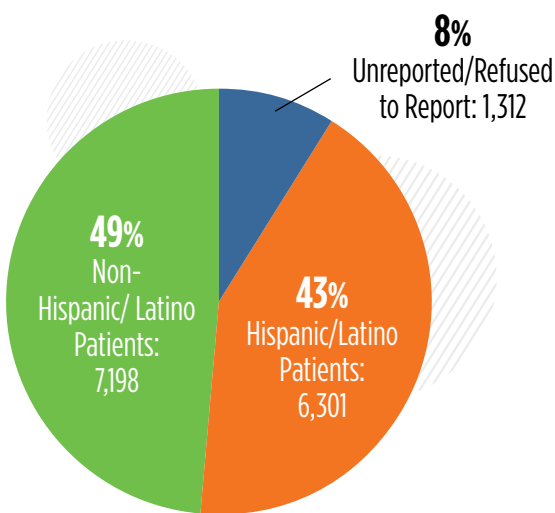

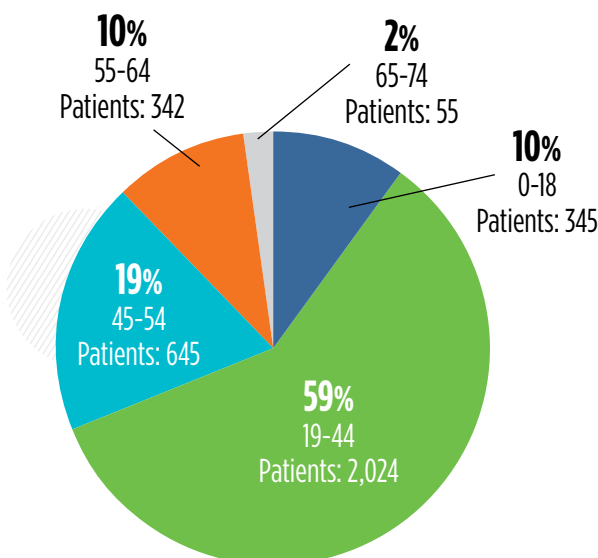

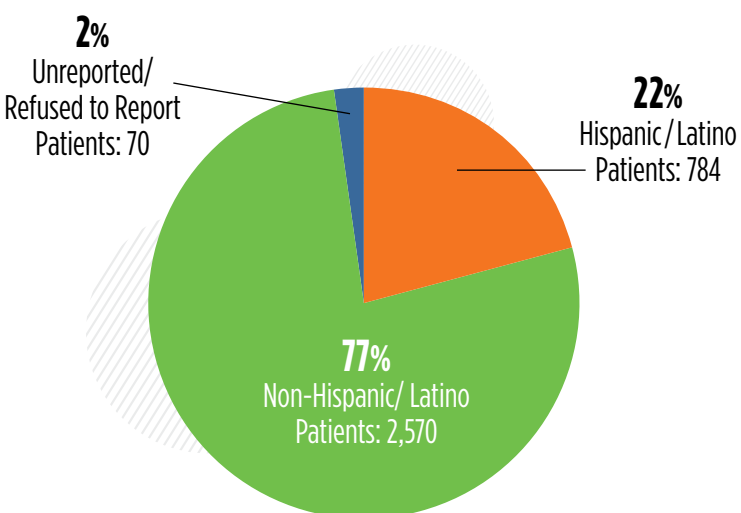

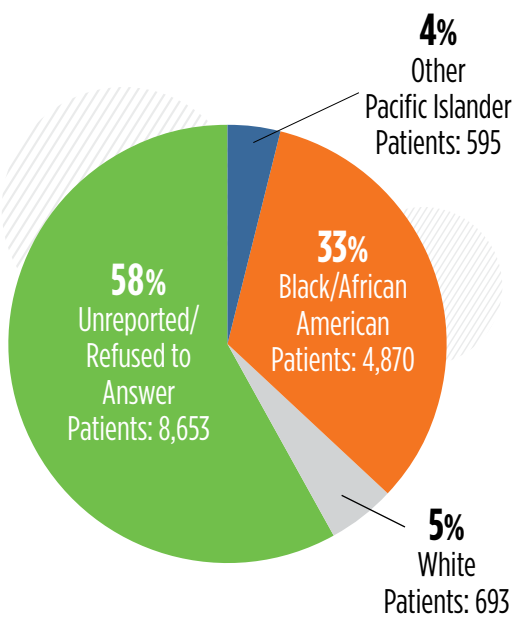

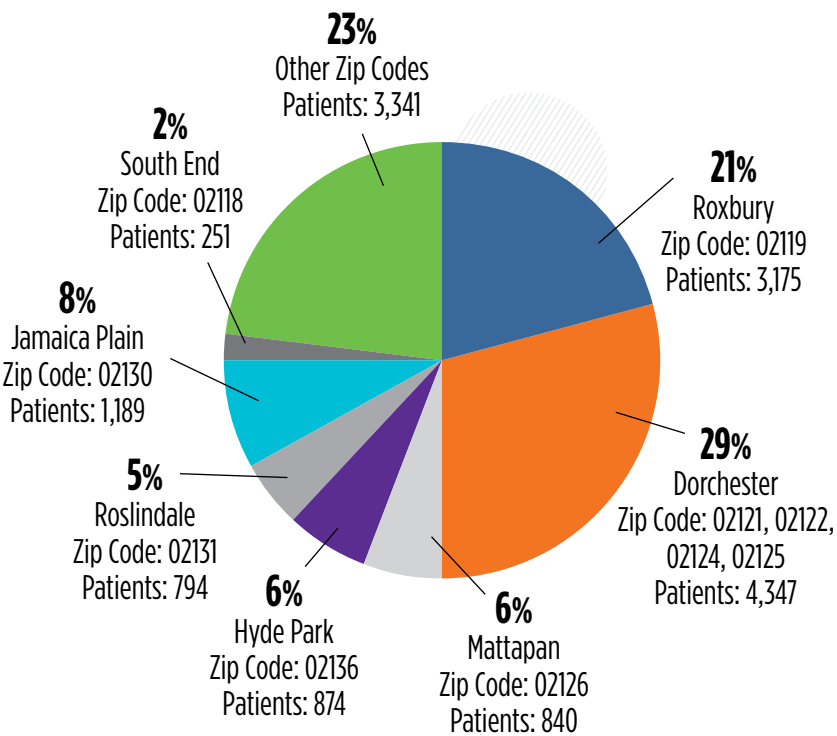

Patients By Race



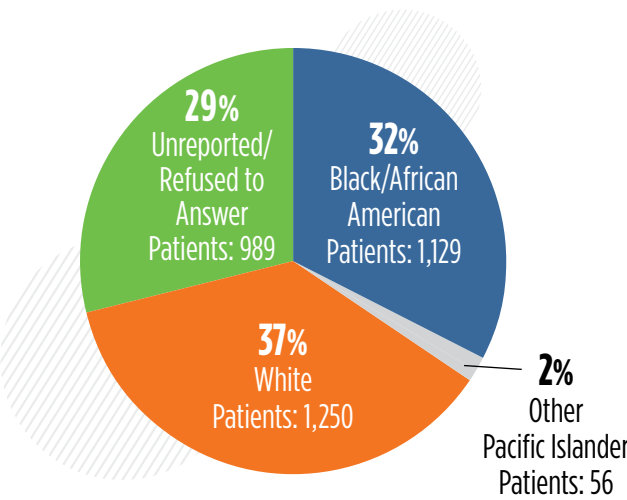

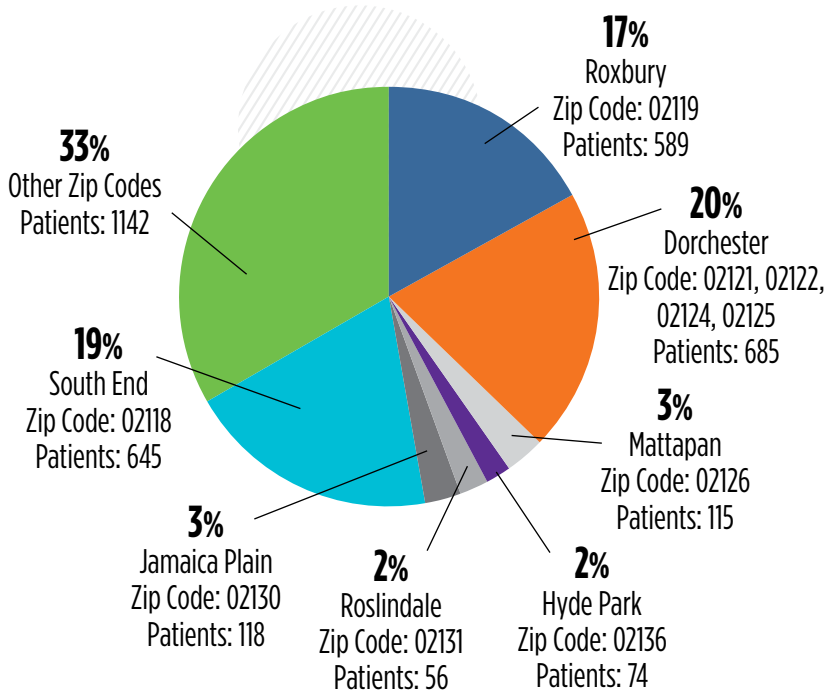

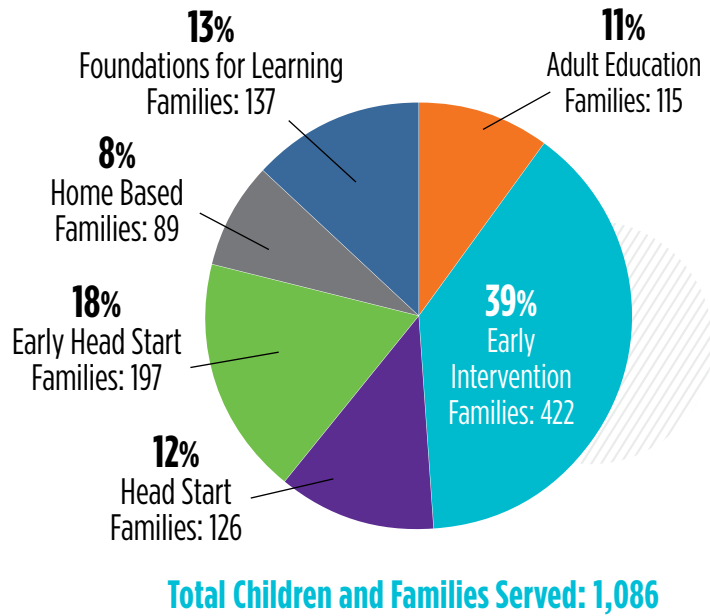

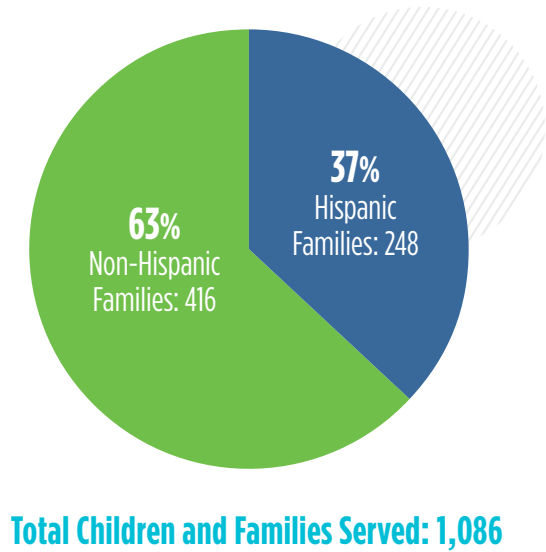

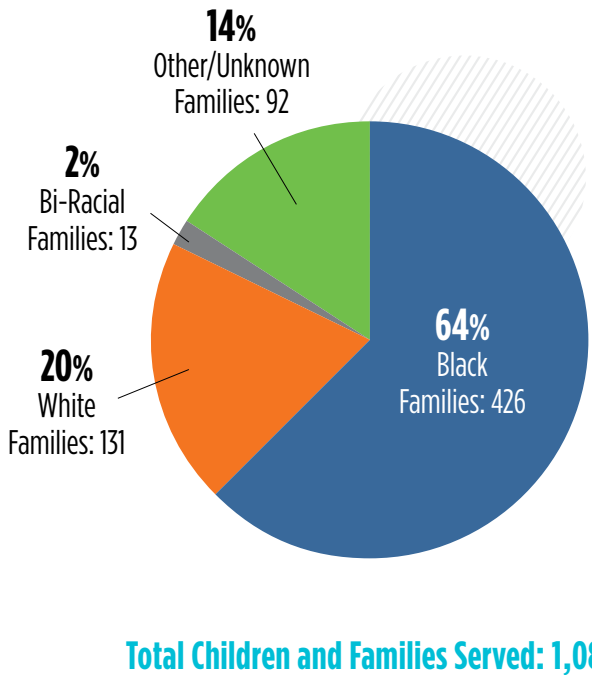
Children and Families Served by Program



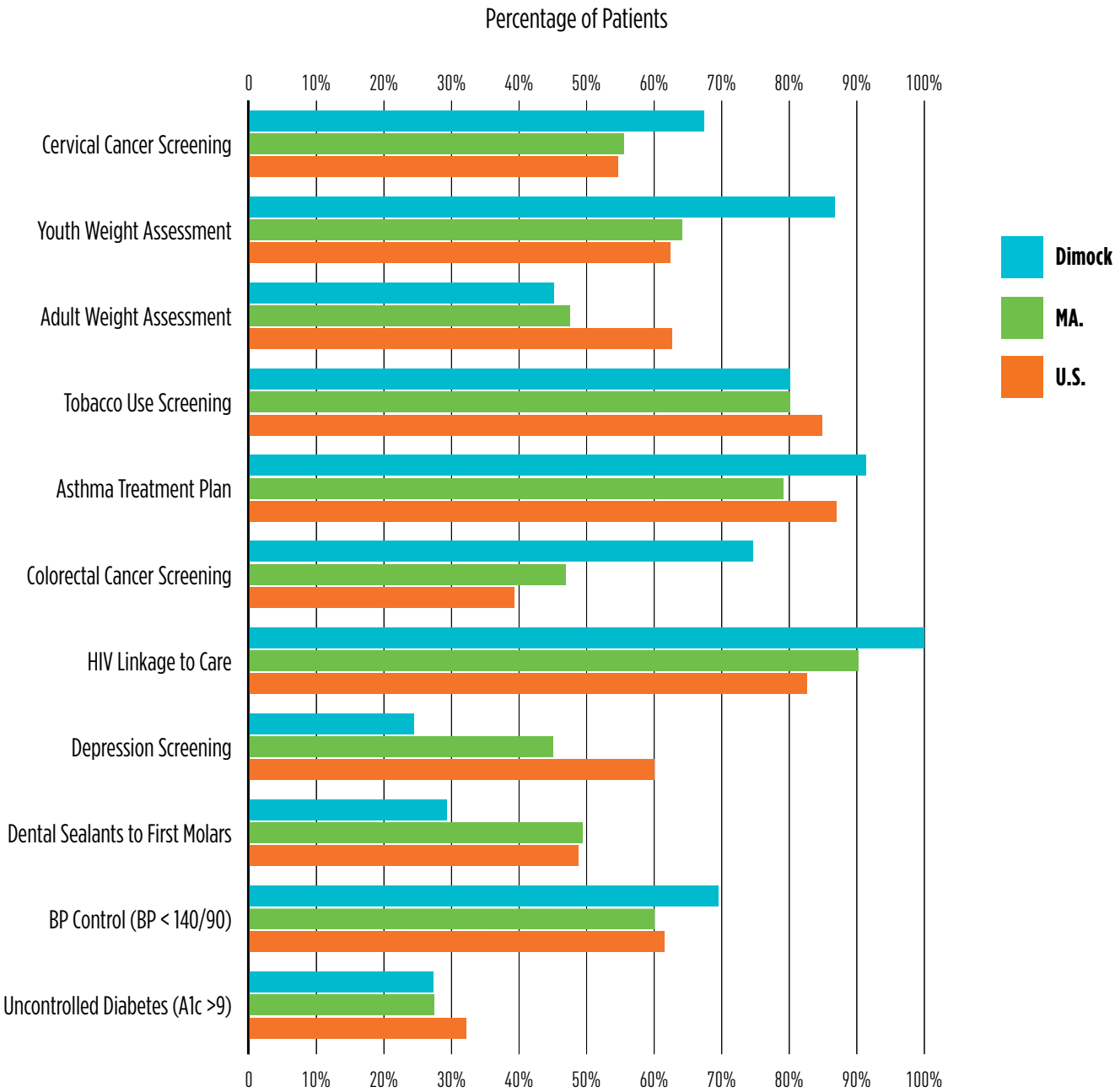
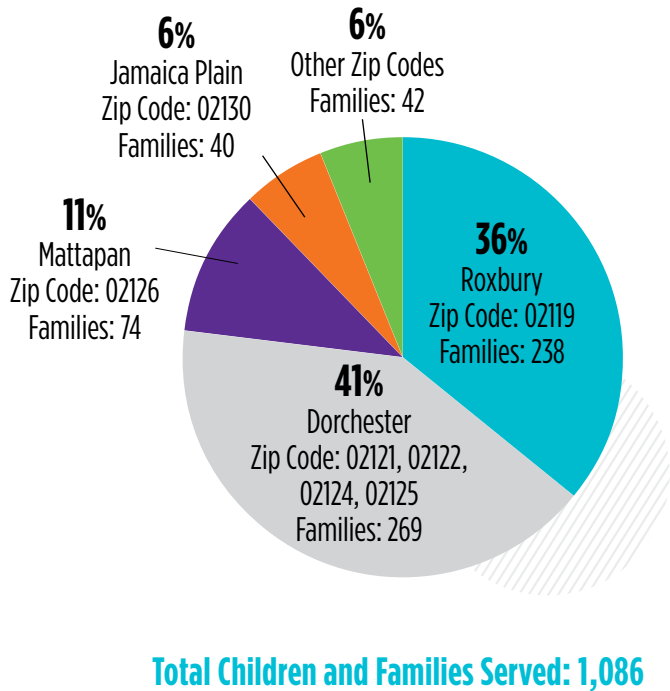
Children and Families Served by Ethnicity

Breaking New Ground to Open New Doors



January 17, 2017 Groundbreaking

On January 17, 2017, The Dimock Center broke ground on a state-of-the-art renovation project to restore its aging detoxification facility and strengthen its comprehensive substance use disorder treatment services. The newly renovated Dr. Lucy Sewall Center for Acute Treatment Services will increase The Dimock Center's inpatient acute treatment beds from 30 to 40, reaching an additional 1,000 people annually for a total of 4,000 patients served each year.

Construction management firm **Timberline Construction** led the renovation and expansion inside the existing space, to create the new detox facility. The renovation, designed by **Platt Anderson Freeman Architects**, will not only increase the capacity to serve more patients, but will also provide a state-of-the-art facility, including residential double occupancy units, open nurses' stations, integrated case management offices, a multipurpose community room and integrated security.

The project is the result of Dimock’s \$16.4 million capital campaign, **Building the Road to Recovery**, which was supported by lead contributor **The Yawkey Foundations**, as well as the three major hospital networks in Boston - **Beth Israel Deaconess Medical Center**, **Partners HealthCare**, and **Boston Medical Center**. The Dimock Center received significant support from a **MassDevelopment** and **Capital One Community Renewal Fund**, with Capital One serving as tax credit investor.

Dimock’s Ruth Kelley Ummi’s House (RKUH) provides mothers in recovery from substance use disorder and their children with housing and comprehensive supportive services.
