



On April 4, 2018, The Dimock Center had the great joy of cutting the ribbon to officially open the Dr. Lucy Sewall Center for Acute Treatment Services. The project was the result of Dimock's \$16.4 million capital campaign, Building the Road to Recovery, which was supported by lead contributor The Yawkey Foundations, as well as the three major hospital networks in Boston - Beth Israel Deaconess Medical Center, Partners HealthCare, and Boston Medical Center. The Dimock Center received significant support from a MassDevelopment and Capital One Community Renewal Fund, with Capital One serving as tax credit investor.

The restoration and renovation of the aging detoxification center increased our capacity and expanded our substance use disorder treatment services. Today, the Sewall Center is able to serve a total of 4,000 people per year with a comprehensive and integrated treatment program. We are so grateful for the monumental support of The Dimock Center's Community Foundation Board, the Campaign Task Force Committee and all of the community leaders and legislators who worked hard to make it possible.





Over 1,000 people came out to walk and run through the beautiful neighborhood of Roxbury in celebration of health and wellness. With the leadership of Tufts Health Plan, the Tufts Health Plan Health and Wellness Pavilion was the largest yet featuring over 40 vendors. The Kids' Fun Run, hosted by Relmagine Play and CEO & Founder Betty Francisco, brought incredible energy to the day with a fun obstacle course and a color run.







Operating Revenue by Source






PATIENTS BY RACE




PATIENTS BY ETHNICITY



PATIENTS BY AGE




PATIENTS BY ZIP CODE




FY2018 BEHAVIORAL HEALTH DEMOGRAPHICS


PATIENTS BY RACE




PATIENTS BY ETHNICITY



PATIENTS BY AGE






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FY2018 CHILD AND FAMILY DEMOGRAPHICS













CHILDREN AND FAMILIES SERVED BY ZIP CODE
